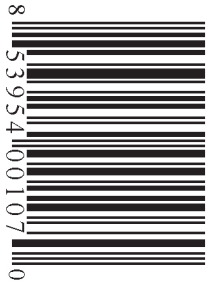

Too hot to grill? Collect instead

The bags of charcoal briquettes and cans of lighter fluid are long gone, and all those meals of blackened hot dogs and charred hamburgers, topped off with marshmallows burnt to a crisp, have been eaten, digested, and forgotten. Back in the day, Mom might have been Queen of the Kitchen, but Dad was the undisputed King of the Grill. Years later, nostalgic memories of the Old Man taking his place before an open fire remain vivid in the minds of many. Little wonder, then, that today's collectors are scooping up cooking tools and eating utensils, tableware and colorful accessories that have survived over the decades since those mid-century backyard barbecues.

Al fresco dining is nothing new. Early humans cooked raw meat over a fire and then devoured it outdoors. Over time, this process was refined, and as things evolved, picnicking was something enjoyed by generations of folks, including the gentry, not out of necessity but by choice. Eating somewhere other than at the kitchen table became more widespread, spurred by increased mobility and thanks to the introduction of the automobile. In fact, some vehicles included picnic baskets and accompanying accoutrement, offered as accessories; these items are now collectible.

Fast forward to the days just after World War II, when returning veterans married their sweethearts and built their nests in the suburbs. No need to drive to a picnic ground when a warm weather party could be shifted from inside the house to the backyard, patio, or poolside. Somehow, food cooked and eaten outside just seemed to taste better.

Backyard barbecues became synonymous with suburban living. Hosts seated their guests at wooden picnic tables, often ones that they had built themselves. While some backyard cooks presided over portable charcoal grills, others went to the extreme effort of constructing a backyard brick barbecue (check out season six, episode 23 of "I Love Lucy").

Regardless of how elaborate the setting, in the end, cooking over the grill and eating outdoors was theater. And

that created a necessity for props. Among those always on the look-out for mid-century barbecue-related items is Massachusetts resident Jimmie Bucci. Explaining why interest in these outdoor meals continues decades later, he suggested its roots might be found in pop culture of the day. "Maybe our fascination with picnics was inspired by seeing William Holden and Kim Novak in the 1956 film "Picnic," he suggested. "Or maybe by seeing Julie Andrews and the von Trapp children in the Alps. Or perhaps it was just years of watching Frankie and Annette in all those Beach Party movies." Whatever the case, there is a wide range of outdoor dining items still available on the market, ones that embrace the spirit of the times.

Begin with the grill itself. Surprisingly, tabletop models, as well as free-standing grills, still exist, many of them in pristine or like-new condition. Perched on tripod-like stands, some are diminutive (think table-top) while others are full size. Although many were used extensively at the time, Bucci explained, there are those that were a Father's Day gift which, at most, was used on the following Fourth of July before being

repacked in its original box and stashed away. As a result, what might have sold for \$10 a bit more than half century ago can now command \$200 to \$300 (in good

Weather cooperates for July Allegan Antiques Market

ALLEGAN, Mich. — The weatherman predicted rain but it didn't come true. Instead, moderate temperatures and light breezes greeted dealers and shoppers at the July 26 edition of the popular West Michigan monthly summer antique market at the Allegan Fairgrounds.

"This is like the spring day we were promised but never came" said dealer Jamie Stackhouse, who took a day off from her nearby store, Featherstone Antique Mall in Fennville, Mich., to attend the Allegan Show.

"Family help" seemed to be a common theme at the July show. Frank and Susan Bednarek of Whitehall, Mich., and daughter Anna of Fennville hosted side by side booths and both were assisted by 7-year-old granddaughter Francine, a regular helper at the monthly event. Although the booths were said to contain a mixture of Americana and Modernism, the favorite for young Francine seemed to be a turn of century oak wood rocking horse with original paint, priced at \$445 by Grandma Susan.

Still more family help was evident at the booth of Terry McBurney, Ada, Mich. Adult daughters Karen and Kristin were said to be in charge of research, pricing, loading and unloading plus "all around support staff" activities.

McBurney, a well known collector and published author of news articles concerning antique fishing lures and similar items served up a booth with more than 1,000 vintage goodies, including a 4-inch-long 1920s Heddon wood Tadpolly for \$100 and a similarly aged Crab Wiggler that could be displayed in your den – or used -- for \$75.

Little hands also were busy helping at the booth of Auddie and Kris-sy Borkowski, Old School and Such

Antiques, in southwestern Michigan. Daughter Amelia, age 6 and three year old son, Bronson rounded out the sales team.

The family is easy to spot, since they carry goodies and set up from an old fashioned big yellow school bus. They creatively changed the painted name on back from "school bus" to "cool bus"

Bottle show will bring seminars and exhibits to Reno

RENO, Nevada – Antique bottle and glass enthusiasts will want to mark their calendars for July 28-31. That's when the Federation of Historical Bottle Collectors (FOHBC) will hold its 2022 National Antique Bottle Convention in Reno. The show and sale event will be held at the Grand Sierra Resort.

"I'm pleased to announce that this year's convention will be held in our Western Region, in the 'Biggest Little City in the World', and be our first national event after a two-year pause due to the pandemic," said Ferdinand Meyer V, past three-time president of the FOHBC and one of the driving forces for the event. "Along with the traditional bottle show and sale will be educational seminars, a judged bottle shootout competition, silent auction, cocktail party and banquet, membership breakfast meeting, displays, team bowling event, bottle appraisals, youth events, raffles and many other activities."

The many events will make for a packed itinerary. People don't have to be an FOHBC member to attend, but membership is encouraged and available at the show, plus online, at www.fohbc.org. There will be two very special exhibits at this year's convention:

- Top 25 Western Whiskey Cylinders: This display is expected to attract a special grouping of bottles that will easily approach \$1 million in total value. Such a display may never happen again and, with the help of the collecting community, will provide an attraction that, alone, is worth attending the Reno 2022 Convention to witness.

clothing and a treasure box and lid.

This year's FOHBC show is a must-attend for antique bottle and glass enthusiasts and members of the many antique bottle clubs scattered across the country. Diggers and pickers will also find the show of great interest. Antique bottle collectors are very passionate about a category of collecting that's enjoyed a meteoric rise in popularity in recent years. There will even be a free appraisal table for people to bring in their finds and possessions.

Educational seminars and their presenters include: Morgan Oyster Beds Bottle Finds (John Shroyer); Marbles (Jeff Wichmann); Grace Brothers Brewing Co. (John Burton); and Dr. Charles Craig, Dr. John Henion and Hulbert H. Warner: Their Connections, Lawsuits, Competition and Eventual Business Demise (Michael Seeliger).

A pair of fun Youth Corner activities are planned for kids interested in getting started in the hobby. The first one involves Children's Bottle Grab Bags, where the FOHBC

will provide about 50 bottle grab bags for kids ten and under, during the General Admission hours of the show (July 29-31). Each bag will have an antique hand-blown bottle, in good condition and embossed. Limit one bottle grab bag per child.

The other event is a Scavenger Hunt, for children aged 8 and up, at the GSR Summit Pavilion showroom floor. Organizers will prepare a list defining specific items, which the participants will seek to gather or complete all items on the list, usually without purchasing them, either individually or in small teams. The goal is to complete most or all of the items on the list.

the their spot to check out two round 10-inch-diameter cast metal and brass fire extinguisher signs, offered for \$85 and \$125 each, plus an early 11 1/2-inch-tall cast iron "fire-mark" house sign, indicating the property was insured, for \$165.

Jane Kesteloot, Plain Jane's Antiques, didn't have to drive far to Allegan from nearby Mattawan to show off an item with a makers mark from nearby South Haven. Built by the Overton Co., the 1930-40s 3 1/2-foot-wide modernistic wooden table featured a removable oval shape top that could be used as serving tray. She estimated the age as 1930-40s and priced it at \$300.

Halloween collectors stopped short to check out a glass display box full of 25 different items from that spooky holiday mostly from the 1950s and priced at \$8 to \$75 each, by Ray and Glenda Fultz, Three Rivers, Mich. When asked how long they had been showing at Allegan, Ray took a deep breath and blurted out, "Oh, gosh it's been about 20 years!"

"This is the best show in the state" said Doug Auer of Hastings, Mich., a "10 year shopper and 14 year dealer" of what he termed 'industrial, repurposed and country collectibles.' Many stopped to admire his pair of 8-inch and 12-inch tall tin and brass vehicle driving lamps that could be taken home for \$125 and \$225 each.

Known for his unusual finds, Dave Dent of Sarasota, Fla., did not disappoint visitors as he pointed with pride to a pair of 26-inch-tall vintage heavy plaster female figures shaped

and painted as a Navy nurse and an officer. Thought to have been used in a Navy recruiter's office, they could grace your home for \$185 each.

Advertising and automotive collectors hovered around the booth of Allegan dealers Don and Kathy Hoover of Valparaiso, Ind. Their 22- 35-inch instruction print of a 1941 Ford motor priced at \$40 was the main attraction. Others checked out the couples' massive display of 1950-60 collectible Pyrex glass dinner pieces offered at \$15 and up.

"This set of chairs is stopping everyone" said one shopper taking a close look at four early 20th century

Francoise Carre designer metal "Pinwell Chairs" shown by Greg and Roxanne Daugherty, Junk in the Trunk Antiques, Coloma, Mich. The set could grace your home for \$550.

This year marks the 43rd anniversary the Allegan Antiques Market under the direction of 82-year-old Larry Wood and as is the case with many dealers — it's a family affair. The promoter has mentioned in recent years that his two daughters, Kelli and Terry, are taking a more active role at the popular market.

"No more 12-13 hour days for me," said Wood, adding I'll still be at the market, "but for a normal guy's 8-hour workday right now."

The Allegan Antiques Market, located midway between Kalamazoo and Grand Rapids, is held the last Sunday of each month during the warm-weather season.

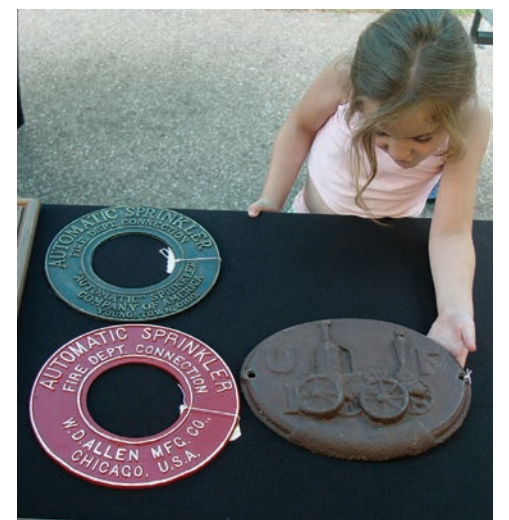

Gas prices curbed shoppers at this year's Route 40 Yard Sale

The regional yard sale season is upon us. Several have already wrapped up for the year, including the National Road/Route 40 Yard Sale which ran from June 1-5. All told, the multi-day, multi-state sale came off successfully. Idyllic weather kept shoppers out all four days and there was plenty of activity.

Solid promotion set the stage for a successful event. The main Facebook page for the sale, the "Historic National Road Yard Sale - US 40 Sales" had nearly weekly postings dating back to February. Other Facebook pages and groups, like the 4,500-member "Historic National Road Yard Sale Festival - US 40 Sales and Information" provided abundant information on where shoppers could find individual sales during their travels.

While there was plenty in its favor, the sale and its participants were influenced by economic realities. Post-pandemic inflation seemed to have prodded more sellers than usual to participate. Budget-squeezed buyers were unashamedly after bargains, while gas prices and other rising costs may have led many to curtail shopping or even cancel their plans.

What was most apparent this year was the heightened number of sellers. In just one six-mile rural stretch between Springfield and Donnelsville, Ohio, more than a dozen sales were spotted. Very likely, the proliferation stemmed from families taking advantage of the sale to generate extra income. Whether inflation drew out sellers or not, buyers were enthusiastic over the turnout.

The number of sellers was complemented

by the volume of the merchandise available for sale. There were, of course, the typical household items and baby clothes - which many people were seeking. Yet, antiques and other collectibles were also abundant. Whether it was inexpensive vintage glassware, antique furniture, or even high-dollar collectible cars, plenty was available.

By way of a few examples, just past the western edge of Springfield, one seller had a 1960s Sears tandem bike, in restorable condition, for \$50. On a rural stretch heading into Donnelsville, another seller offered a 12-tin, square-nailed primitive jelly cupboard for \$200. A military collectibles dealer near New Carlisle had a vintage three-

wheel Harley-Davidson for \$15,000.

Although sellers were plentiful, many of them reported less-than-stellar traffic. Historically, the Route 40 event attracts throngs of shoppers to most sale locations. This year, whether it was down a rural road at a barn sale or alongside a collection of houses, only one or two people were typically present. When others arrived, it wasn't in clusters like in previous years; instead, it was typically a sole vehicle stopping.

For small businesses like National Antiques in New Carlisle, the scarcity of shoppers was glaring. Owner Larry Greene said he gets a big bump in business during the sale - usually five figures worth. This year, things didn't appear anywhere on track for that. Even individual sellers noticed the drop. One, near Vandalia Ohio, said traffic was way down compared to previous years. For her, Friday was particularly disappointing. Fortunately, like many, she noted that Thursday had been reasonably busy.

Undoubtedly, record-high fuel prices applied some pressure.

Fortunately, patrons seemed to be buying. It was rare to see someone browse a sale and leave empty-handed. Repeatedly, shoppers vocalized how happy they were to snag a bargain on something they needed. For LeeAnn Demers of Lee's Dragonfly Boutique, business was brisk, and people were enthusiastically buying. It didn't hurt that much of her merchandise was vintage

clothing - and sold from an alluring trailer-turned-boutique parked in her driveway. Like the seller in Vandalia, Demers noted Thursday's traffic was actually better than Friday's.

In 2021, the Route 40 Yard Sale benefited from people's post-Covid pent-up desire to get out. This year, the sale took an odd turn - it was fruitful for some, yet disappointing for others. Perhaps next year "normal" will be part of our vocabulary again, and regional yard sales like the Historic National Road/Route 40 Yard Sale will get back to their routine.

William Mangels targets will highlight Nye & Company auction

BLOOMFIELD, N.J. – Nye & Company Auctioneers will kick off their hot summer Chic and Antique Estate Treasures Auction on Wednesday, July 20, with designer and English furniture and fine and decorative art.

The cleaning out of a packed house and yard led to the remarkable discovery of not one, but two William F. Mangels silhouette shooting gallery targets. The example tentatively titled Shorty or The Draw is a known form that rarely comes to auction. The other, The Stick Up, is thought to be a previously unknown example of Mangels' ability and incorporates steam pipes on verso to simulate the smoke of a gunshot when the target is struck.

Mangels formed the Wm F. Mangels Co. Carousel Works in 1890, having worked in Coney Island, New York for nearly a decade under James McCullough, learning the maintenance and servicing of the various shooting galleries. His mechanical and light-up galleries raised the bar far above their stationary forerunners, thus establishing his genius and reputation as the Father of the Modern Arcade Game.

A renowned New York City psychologist's estate is included in the auction and includes a remarkable pair of Italian painted and carved angels gifted to the consignor from his close friend Gloria Vanderbilt. One of her pieces of art, a collage, is included in the sale, along with a pair of Ionic columns and some European paintings.

A private family from the Continent is consigning a watercolor of a Butterfly, signed by Albert Bierstadt (German-American, 1830-1902), purchased in Madrid, and an oil on canvas of Melvin B. Warren's Supply Train that was acquired in Switzerland. Thom Ross's (American, b. 1952) whimsical interpretation of Robert E. Lee and his pet chicken along with works by Frank A. Barney, (American, 1862-1854) round out some of the fine art highlights.

1952) whimsical interpretation of Robert E. Lee and his pet chicken along with works by Frank A. Barney, (American, 1862-1854) round out some of the fine art highlights.

A collection of Ralph Lauren and other brand-name furniture from a Florida family comprises a large portion of the decorative arts. There are pairs of sofas, wing chairs, side tables, bedsteads and more.

Some of the 18th and 19th century furniture includes an elaborately inlaid Baroque walnut wardrobe, German; a fine Regency

condition) on the resale market.

That is only the beginning. In addition to the grill itself, collectors prize sets of cooking utensils. According to Bucci, utensil sets might include forks, tongs, and spatulas, as well as skewers and brushes. Many remain complete and intact, in their original decorated boxes; as with many barbecue-related items, iconic graphics make these tools particularly desirable. Expect to pay \$25 to \$50 for basic sets, but more for those of particular interest.

As president of the Vintage Tablecloth Lovers Club, Bucci is particularly interested in tabletop linens, and there are plenty of barbecue-themed examples that survive to this day. Fabric tablecloths might feature images of grills and coolers, cooking utensils and picnic food, chef's hats and men working the grill, as well as "campy" sayings. Prices for these tablecloths can be "well over \$100," depending on the graphics. He pointed out that, among the most desirable tablecloths are the select few that feature a woman as the "chef." Terry cloth tablecloths are popular now among collectors, just as they were when they were new, in light of their easy-care feature. On the other hand, many outdoor diners opted for decorated paper tablecloths, examples of which have survived to this day.

Additionally, decorated towels and napkins, as well as cooking mitts and aprons (including those designed for men) are also popular among collectors.

Although mid-century picnickers were not always as particular as modern folks are when it comes to leaving food unchilled for hours, coolers were popular then, and they remain so. Bucci noted that many people collect ice chests, particularly ones in a recognizable tartan plaid pattern; often red, they were also manufactured in yellow, pink, and green, as well as other colors. Also collectable are matching beverage coolers (including ones with spigots), ice buckets, and metal picnic "baskets." There's even a matching "Scotch Grill."

Made of metal, plastic, or paper (it's possible to find surviving unopened packages), dinner plates might be sold as a set or accompanied by matching tumblers; they may also include a place to rest a cup, or have dividers to keep the coleslaw and baked beans from running together. Bucci doesn't pass up serving

trays and platters if he finds the decorations appealing. Other accessories on the market include decorated flatware; invitations, complete with envelopes; and barbecue cookbooks. Hamburger presses and meat markers used to indicate the degree of "doneness" also assisted the chef and can be found today.

Bucci's collection began in the 1970s, when these items sold for "next to nothing." Today, prices for these, as well as for many mid-century collectibles, continue to rise and be strong. As for condition, he noted that some collectors are bothered by small dents and a bit of rust, which may or may not affect the price. For others, including himself, it "doesn't seem to matter. I collect things for display." Or to use. Even if "we are bothered by the occasional ant or two."
